Holography is a fascinating subject utilizing one of nature's most fundamental principles: interference. Using coherent illumination, as provided by a laser, the spatial information from a three-dimensional physical configuration can be transferred into a two-dimensional recording medium. Once recorded, upon illumination of the two-dimensional medium the three-dimensional information of the original configuration is revealed. *Holograms: A Cultural History* is a very well written, engaging, and extensively documented, book on the cultural and societal impacts of holography... a wondrous discipline that should continue to marvel us as recording and displaying technologies continue to advance.
